Sticky Group Discussion Questions for Sunday, March 1, 2015

Christ's Victory Command

Part 1: "Be of good cheer; your sins are forgiven" (Matthew 9:2).

- 1. Re-read Matthew 9:1-9 in a couple different versions of the Bible. What one-word descriptions do you think would best characterize the reactions of the following people to the things that happen in this story?
 - ... the paralytic?
 - ... the ordinary people in the crowd?
 - ... the scribes ?
 - ... Jesus?
- 2. Take several minutes to have a discussion of the concept of sin.
 - Try, as a group, to come up with a definition of sin.
 - Read Genesis 3:1-6. How do our sins today line up with Adam and Eve's sin?
 - o listened to the slanders against God
 - o doubted God's love and His word
 - o looked at what God had forbidden
 - o lusted for what God had forbidden
 - o absolute disobedience to God's command
 - Read some of the lists of sins in the Bible. How do these lists impact your thinking about sin? How much variety in kinds of sins do you find in these passages?
 - o Exodus 20:3-17
 - o Mark 7:20-23
 - o Romans 1:28-32
 - o 1 Cor 6:9-12
 - o Galatians 5:19-21
 - o Colossians 3:5-10
 - o 1 Timothy 1:8-11
 - o James 2:10-11
 - o Psalm 51:3
 - Is forgiveness of sin the greatest need of human beings?
 - What does God offer, according to Psalm 130:3-4?
- 3. Based on the story from Matthew 9, and from other sources and experiences, how do you know Jesus has the authority to forgive sin?
- 4. How do you know that Jesus does, in fact, forgive your sins? As part of your answer, consider the following Bible passages:
 - Hebrews 7:23-28
 - Hebrews 9:11-15
 - Hebrews 9:24-28
 - 1 John 1:7
- 5. It has been said that in Christ we have been set free from the penalty of sin; we are being set free from the power of sin; and we will, one day, be set free from the presence of sin. Discuss your reactions to that thought. Is it true? Is it helpful to you? Do you find that as a follower of Christ you are experience a growing freedom from the power of sin. Why, or why not?
- 6. If you were to hear the voice of the Lord Jesus Himself saying to you personally at this moment, "Be of good cheer; your sins are forgiven," would it make a difference to you?
